SUBURBAN LEAGUE

SPORTS POLICIES

BOYS/GIRLS TRACK

A. <u>LEAGUE SCHEDULE</u>

- 1. A round-robin schedule of league play will be contested prior to the league meet. Boys and Girls will compete in dual meets at opposite sites. The order of competition will be drawn every two years.
- 2. All meets are to be run as scheduled and approved by the League Council.
- 3. In case of cancellation, all league meets must be rescheduled at the earliest possible date, which is convenient to both schools involved.

B. <u>LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP</u>

A league champion will be determined by the following formula:

1. In dual meets, the following points will be awarded:

2 points for each win 1 point for each tie 0 for each loss

2. In the League Tournament Meet the following points will be awarded:

1st place ... 14 points 2nd place ... 12 points 3rd place ... 10 points 4th place ... 8 points 5th place ... 6 points 6th place ... 4 points 7th place ... 2 points 8th place ... 0

- 3. League meet entries must be sent to meet manager one week prior to the meet.
- 4. Three (3) entries per school, per event (except for relays) are permitted.
- 5. There will be a coaches' meeting the Tuesday prior to the league meet. (????)
- 6. The league meet will score 8 places similar to OHSAA State meet.

The team with the most points from dual meets and the League Tournament meet will be declared the champion.

If two teams tie for first place, a co-championship will be declared

C. OFFICIALS

- 1. At least one registered official shall be present for all dual meets.
- 2. A starter/referee, assistant starter, and head finish line judge will be contracted for the league meet. All must be registered track officials.
- 3. One registered track official will be at each field event during the league meet.
- 4. Each school must provide 3 workers for each session of the league championship meet.

D. RULES

National Federation and OHSAA rules apply at all times. All Suburban League policies must be followed.

E. FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT

The Home school is responsible for maintaining facilities and equipment, which are consistent with National Federation rules and standards for safety.

F. PUBLICITY

- 1. The Home school is to call dual meet results into the Akron Beacon Journal and Plain Dealer.
- 2. The league meet manager will call results of the league meet into the Beacon Journal and Plain Dealer unless a reporter is present.

G. MEET TIME

All dual meets are to start at 4 p.m. unless mutually changed.

H. CROWD CONTROL

- 1. Coaches are responsible for the conduct of athletes during all meets.
- 2. The league meet manager will arrange for marshals at the league meet.

I. FINANCE

1. Any profit from the league meet is to go into the league treasury.

- 2. The league meet manager is to receive \$150.
- 3. There will be no admission charged at dual meets.
- 4. An admission will be charged at each session of the league meet.

L. JUNIOR VARSITY REGULATIONS

1. Extra runners are allowed in dual meets.

M. JUNIOR HIGH REGULATIONS

- 1. A round-robin schedule for boys and girls will be developed and approved by the League Council; it will follow the same rotation as the high school for boys and for girls.
- 2. It is recommended that registered starters be contracted for all meets.
- 3. Pole Vault is prohibited.

ALL LEAGUE SELECTION PROCESS

- 1. Will be determined at the League Championship finals:
 - a. 1st place plaque
 - b. 2nd place foil certificate
 - c. 3rd and 4th places– paper certificates
- 2. Each relay team member will receive awards.
- 3. The championship coach will be awarded a championship plaque.
