2016 - 2017 Changes/Additions

A. General Rules

- a. United States Bowling Congress (USBC) rules will govern all matches and tournament play except where modified by the OHSAA.
- b. The Suburban League Bowling schedule will consist of a double round robin format. For each match teams will bowl 2 individual games and 3 baker games. Match winners will be determined based on total team pin count in all 5 games.
 - i. In case of a tie after all games, a two frame roll-off will be bowled. One bowler picked by the coach from each team will bowl the 9th and 10th frames to determine the winner. Additional two frame competitions will occur until there is a winner. Coaches can change bowlers after each two frame roll off. Pins are NOT to be added to total score.
- c. The league champion will be determined by each team's overall won/loss record during league matches at the end of the season.
- d. All Suburban League matches are scheduled to start at or as close to 4:00 PM as possible.
- e. Visiting teams will begin bowling on the odd numbered lanes with 3 bowlers on the first pair and 2 bowlers on the 2nd pair. Home tames will begin bowling on the even numbered lanes with 2 bowlers on the first pair and 3 bowlers on the second. Baker games will be bowled on the first pair of lanes used for competition. IF the bowling center needs to change this to accommodate leagues, an exception can be made.
- f. A league coordinator will be used to tabulate standings and statistics for the league. Each school will pay the league coordinator a fee of \$100.00 (\$50.00 each for boys and girls).
- g. Each home school is reminded to forward their match results to the league bowling coordinator as soon as possible following each match. The coordinator will tabulate all match results on Sundays and will email standing to all Suburban League coaches and athletic directors on a weekly basis.

B. All Suburban League Team

- a. The top male and top female bowler with the highest average in league matches will be named Bowler of the Year.
- b. After each Bowler of the Year is selected, the 1st team all Suburban League teams for boys and girls will consist of the remaining top 6 averages in all individual games bowled in the league matches and tournaments. The second team will consist of the 7th 12th highest averages. In order to be eligible for these awards, a bowler must participate in more than 50% (60%) of all individual Suburban League games.
- c. Each league school will have the opportunity to select 1 male and 1 female bowler to be awarded Honorable Mention All Suburban League.
- d. League champions will be determined by the final league records. First place teams with the same records will result in co-champions.
